 Russ Stump: R. Stump stated that Home Depot will be installing a burn pit by the army tank for retired flags on Wednesday, March 28th.
R. Stump stated they will be installing rocks with each military branch on them at the canal at various locations. <u>Anthony Gurski motioned to allow the Bicentennial</u> <u>Committee to install military branch rocks at the canal, seconded by Thomas</u> <u>Fickinger, carried by Council.</u> R. Stump stated they are hoping to have a flag burning ceremony on June 14th. Council further discussed. VFW and Legion will try to coordinate flag burning ceremony.

- Injunction Hearing: Solicitor Hobbs stated several liens have been paid and the Injunction Hearing will be Wednesday, April 11th.
 - Solicitor Hobbs stated that no appeal was filed for 50 Spruce Street.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

- Officer Vandermartin read over the monthly police report.
- Mayor Shiffer stated Chief Trotter attended a Command Structure Development Training this past Saturday and Sunday.
- Mayor Shiffer stated there will be a Mock MVA Program out at the school on Friday, April 13th with a rain date of Monday April 16th. Mayor Shiffer stated Chief Trotter and Officer Applegate will be assisting with this.
- Mayor Shiffer discussed the presentation regarding Police Regionalization. Mayor Shiffer stated that DCED conducts a feasibility study free of charge to determine if police regionalization would be beneficial for the borough.
